Vinny is a long-time member of St. Regis Knights of Columbus and the Ronkonkoma community. He started his officer positions as the Recorder, moving up the ladder to Warden, then Chancellor and he is presently the Deputy Grand Knight. He is very proud of the work and positions he has held and always puts 110% into everything he does. He is also the current record holder for shaking down the golfers on the 17th hole for the past golf outings! Vinny was the first coordinator of our annual Oktoberfest and ran it for 3 years and he also ran the St. Regis Family Picnic. He pitches in at a moment's notice to support not just the Knights but also the St. Regis Columbians in their events, and always with a smile on his face. Vinny's wife, Carmela is Past President of the Columbians. For a few years, he also helped setting up for the NY Giving Doll, TOPS and the Seniors. He has helped out at the Council's annual Veterans' luncheon and at St. Patrick's Day Parade functions, participated in the March for Life and the Special Olympics Annual Fishing event and he is also an Usher at St. Joseph Church on Sundays. Dominic graduated from the University of Rhode Island with a Bachelors Degree in Mechanical Engineering. Their love for Dominic is immeasurable and there isn't anything they wouldn't do for him. Vinny was very involved with the St. Joseph's Scouting program, Pack 272, where he was a Den Leader and Cub Master.
